A:	Calvert N. Ellis and Morley J. Mays.
Q:	The Commencement Program listed how many members of the Class of 1964?
A:	169.
Q:	The departments of instruction were grouped into what three divisions?
A:	The Humanities, The Social Studies, The Natural Sciences.
Q:	Who were the Dean's at Juniata in 1964?
A:	Dean of Men – Paul M. Heberling and Dean of Women – R. Christine Yohe.
Q:	What were the six required first semester freshman courses for the Class of 1964?
A:	The Mind, Arts and Humanities, Nature of Society, Nature of Science, Physical Education and English Conference.
Q:	What buildings were constructed and opened during the tenure of the Class of 1964?
A:	Sherwood Hall (1961), South Hall (1962), Beeghly (1963) – Brumbaugh Science Center did not open until 1965.
Q:	When was South Hall first occupied?
A:	1962
Q:	How was Chapel attendance taken in 1964?
A:	A camera shot picture of the audience.
Q:	When was the last "gymnasium initiation" held?
A:	Fall of 1961 – The Class of 1964 was last class to conduct that torture.
Q:	Who was first to complete the 1962 bike ride to the Capitol in Harrisburg?
A:	Rich O'Connell in six hours and twenty-five minutes.
Q:	Who were the first co-editors of the Juniatian?
A:	Judy Fairweather and Judy Carlton started a three-year series of co-editors in 1962.
Q:	What "big name" entertainment group performed on campus in 1962?
A:	The Lettermen.
Q:	Who were the Presidents of the Class of 1964?
A:	60-61 Bob Fulks, 61-62 Hal Yocum, 62-63 Don Detwiler, 63-64 Rolfe Wenner.

A:	WJC.

A:	Winter of 1960-61.
Q:	What sports team went undefeated in 1960 and 1961?
A:	Cross Country.

A: Dr. Binkley.
