**Class of 1964 Supports Juniata with Time and Contributions** - At times, I have heard that some think this newsletter is just a fund drive tool. That is **NOT** at all the case. But, I think it is important to pass on the following summary of our contributions to Juniata College during the recent fund drive/volunteer year that ended May 31, 2006. If you are not interested in these Class accomplishment just skip down to the May Deja Vu article.

**Volunteer Support** - Some times a contribution of time is as important to the College as a financial contribution. Alumni volunteer support helps keep Juniata rated as a top educational institute and can be a factor when seeking grant funds.

Fifteen members of the Class of 1964 provided 454.5 hours of volunteer support to Juniata College. In a NewsGroup Release, it was indicated that the organization "Independent Sector" announced that the estimated value of a volunteer hour in 2005 is \$18.04. So we can be proud of provide over \$8,200 worth of service to our alma mater.

50TH REUNION GIFT FUND -

The 50th Reunion Gift Fund Drive is a ten-year fund drive to accumulate \$64,000 to present to the College at our 50th Reunion in 2014. Contributed funds are held in an investment account managed by Juniata College that pays substantial dividends toward our goal.

We fell a little short of the goal for this year - \$44.63 - and no new contribution were made in May 2006. But, thanks to support from many classmate we already have accumulated \$12,755.27 in the first two years of this ten-year fund drive.
